Relationship between Tariff and BPM

■ **Tariff provides:**

- Rates, Terms and Conditions
- Subject to the “Rule of Reason”

■ **Most Business Practice Manuals provide:**

- Implementation detail that does not significantly affect Rates, Terms and Conditions
- Other material that need not be included in tariff include:
 - Technical Information
 - Examples
 - Templates
 - Timelines



Relationship between Tariff and this BPM

- **Intended to be a roadmap to Section 37**
- **Contains examples, but significantly less additional technical information, timelines, templates et c. than other BPMs**
- **Does not require additional action from Market Participants**



Purpose and Scope of BPM for Rules of Conduct Administration

- **Describes the process for investigating and, when applicable, sanctioning violations of the Rules of Conduct in Section 37 of the ISO Tariff**
- **Includes some background – e.g., the Rules of Conduct (a link to a summary) and DMM monitoring (a high level overview)**
- **Nothing will be removed from Section 37**
- **No plans to modify Section 37 in MRTU Tariff**



Purpose and Scope continued

- **Intent is that communications with Market Participants regarding investigations will explain rights and obligations of the Market Participants**
- **This BPM should not be necessary to understand communications from DMM**
- **This BPM should be helpful background – a beginning to end description of the process**
