Once again, Green Energy Express LLC (“Green Energy Express”) appreciates the opportunity to provide comments in response to the 2010 Transmission Plan and the stakeholder presentations from February 16, 2010 regarding the 2010 Transmission Plan provided by the Staff of the California Independent System Operator (“CAISO”). Green Energy Express continues, however, to be concerned and dismayed that the CAISO Staff’s stakeholder presentation of the 2010 Plan, and the 2010 Plan itself, still do not include any economic analysis, or even any mention of our 2008 Request Window project submission of the Green Energy Express Transmission Project (“GEET Project” or “Project”), which was validly submitted as an economic transmission project through the CAISO’s Request Window in December 2008.

The CAISO’s failure to include any analysis of the Project as part of its Study Results and inclusion in any way within the 2010 Transmission Plan or process thereof, indicates that the CAISO has so far failed to conduct the Transmission Planning Process for the 2010 Transmission Plan in a manner that is transparent and consistent with the requirements of the Transmission Planning Process as specified in the CAISO’s Tariff and the Business Practice Manual for the Transmission Planning Process (“TPP BPM”).

Green Energy Express appreciates opportunities to discuss and communicate these matters with the CAISO as we have done in the recent past. However, our ability to understand the direction and decision process of the CAISO in the transmission planning process, from one year to the next, is providing significant business challenges.
