**MOTION TO INTERVENE OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM
OPERATOR CORPORATION**

Pursuant to Rule 214 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“Commission”), 18 C.F.R. § 385.214, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (“ISO”) hereby moves to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. 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II. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission

systems of Pacific Gas & Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Southern California Edison Company. The ISO is responsible for the reliability of electric transmission to be scheduled through the ISO control area.

The ISO was previously granted intervention in Docket No. ER98-496-000, on December 17, 1997 (81 FERC ¶ 61,322), and in ER98-2160-000 on May 1, 1998 (83 FERC ¶ 61,113). Recent correspondence from Judge Wagner to Sidney Jubien, Senior Staff Counsel for the California Electricity Oversight Board, suggests that parties may nonetheless need to file motions to intervene in the severed sub-dockets. Therefore, in order to confirm its party status in this sub-docket, the ISO is filing this additional motion to intervene. The ISO requests expedited consideration of this motion since testimony in the above-mentioned dockets is due on December 22, 1999.

As the purchaser of the energy and ancillary services offered pursuant to the RMR Contract at issue in this proceeding, the ISO has an interest in the proceeding that cannot adequately be represented by any other party. Accordingly, the ISO requests that it be permitted to intervene herein with full rights of a party.

III. CONCLUSION

Wherefore, for the foregoing reasons, the ISO respectfully requests that the Commission permit it to intervene, and that it be accorded full party status in this proceeding.
