This letter updates the November 18, 2005 response of the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("CAISO") to your inquiry about the status of the above-referenced matter and the CAISO's plans to file a motion to withdraw its Petition for Review of Arbitrator's Award.

The CAISO and San Diego Gas & Electric Company ("SDG&E") continue to work together to coordinate termination of the litigation identified in the SWPL Settlement Agreement and the SWPL Operations Agreement, including this docket. We are also in the process of reviewing the Commission's December 20, 2005 Order on Remand in Docket Nos. ER97-2358-007, et al., ("December 20 Order") that allows Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and SDG&E to recover the cost differential between their Existing Transmission Contracts and Transmission Owner tariffs. That cost recovery issue, and the outcome of the remand, are addressed in the SWPL Settlement Agreement and the SWPL Operations Agreement.

In order to allow the CAISO and SDG&E an opportunity to consider the December 20 Order as it relates to the SWPL settlement, the CAISO proposes to defer filing a motion to withdraw the Petition in this matter. No later than January 31, 2006, we will either file such joint motion to withdraw or provide further update about the status of this matter.
