Dear Mr. Dozier:

On December 3, 2010, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submitted revisions to its Transmission Control Agreement (TCA) to reflect that it assumed operational control of Trans Bay Cable, LLC's transmission rights. CAISO submitted the complete TCA in accordance with Order No. 714.¹ CAISO's TCA is accepted, effective November 23, 2010, consistent with the Commission's October 10, 2006 order.² However, various records of the TCA contain tables that are misaligned, and are therefore not legible. CAISO must revise the format of these records within 30 days of this letter order.³

This filing was noticed on December 6, 2010, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before December 27, 2010. No protests or comments were filed.

This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
