Curtailment Prioritization for Deliverable Projects

## Please provide a summary description of the issue (i.e. 500 words)

Currently, there is a disconnect between deliverability status and priority in market dispatch. Projects that are designated as Energy-Only have the same priority in the real-time market as resources with FCDS that are complying with must-offer obligations. Further, CAISO's recent deliverability enhancements tariff filing at FERC was only partially accepted, leaving the new Off-Peak Deliverability Status with ambiguity as to what the status means for interconnection customers that choose to fund the upgrades to avoid excessive curtailment. There should be a basis for prioritizing curtailment for those generators that achieve OPDS status.

The CAISO should initiate a new process that looks to create distinct priorities for curtailment based on deliverability. For example, FCDS would have highest priority and be the last to face curtailment, while Energy-Only projects would have the lowest priority. Aligning curtailment and deliverability may be an effective method to incentivize much-needed additional transmission investment, and incorporating OPDS into this discussion of curtailment priority can address the policy gap created when FERC rejected CAISO's proposal to tie OPDS status to the ability to self-schedule.
