Reference: Energy Imbalance Market Entity Agreement

On April 18, 2019, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed an Energy Imbalance Market (EIM) Entity Agreement with the City of Seattle, by and through its City Light Department (Seattle). The EIM Entity Agreement sets forth the legal obligations and operational rules for Seattle's participation in the CAISO EIM. The EIM Entity Agreement is accepted for filing, effective June 18, 2019 as requested.¹

This filing was noticed on April 18, 2019, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before May 9, 2019. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as

recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
