Reference: Large Generator Interconnection Agreement

On April 10, 2020, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed an executed Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA) among itself, Valley Electric Association, Inc. (Valley Electric), GridLiance West, LLC (GridLiance West) and Sunshine Valley Solar, LLC (Sunshine Valley) under CAISO's tariff. The LGIA specifies the terms under which Sunshine Valley's 100-megawatt solar photovoltaic generating facility will connect to the Valley Electric substation, and pursuant to which Sunshine Valley Solar will pay for such facilities. The LGIA also denotes the impact of the interconnection on the GridLiance West facilities. The LGIA is accepted for filing, effective June 10, 2020, as requested.<sup>1</sup>

This filing was noticed on April 10, 2020, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before May 1, 2020. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.
