


2013 Summer Grid Outlook

- * Adequate reserve margins statewide.
- *Local reliability concerns for San Diego County and the southern portion of Orange County as a result of the San Onofre Nuclear Generation Station (SONGS) shutdown.
- *Reliability risk for San Diego County is "marginally more challenging" than last summer.
- * Economic growth is adding fuel to increasing demand for electricity.
- Drought is triggering wildfires, which are a major grid concern; flow of imported power could be impacted if blazes threaten high voltage power lines.

Mitigation plan for this summer nearly complete.

- * SDG&E and SCE worked hard to get voltage support devices added to transmission system.
- * Synchronous condensers at nearby Huntington Beach power plant will provide additional voltage support. The devices are installed and currently undergoing testing (official operational date: June 26).
- * Area still at risk for localized outages under extreme conditions.
- * Careful monitoring and management over peak summer conditions required.

Californians need to do their part to help relieve stress on the system during heat waves or other extreme grid conditions by responding to *Flex Alerts* and "shaving peak" electricity use between 4-6 p.m. during "air conditioning rush hour".


