On September 6, 2019, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed revisions to section 40.9.6.2(d) of its Tariff in compliance with a Commission letter order issued on August 9, 2019, in this docket.<sup>1</sup> CAISO's revisions adopt changes recommended by the Cities of Anaheim, Azusa, Banning, Colton, Pasadena, and Riverside, California, and agreed to by CAISO to clarify the payout date and methodology for the distribution of Resource Adequacy Availability Incentive Mechanism funds.<sup>2</sup> CAISO's revisions are in satisfactory compliance with the August 2019 Order, and are accepted for filing, effective August 12, 2019.

This filing was noticed on September 9, 2019, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before September 27, 2019. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.
