COMMENTS ON BEHALF OF THE CITIES OF ANAHEIM, AZUSA, BANNING, COLTON, PASADENA, AND RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA ON THE RELIABILITY SERVICES INITIATIVE – PHASE 2 AND FLEXIBLE RESOURCE ADEQUACY CRITERIA AND MUST OFFER OBLIGATION – PHASE 2 ISSUE PAPER
