## MOTION OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR CORPORATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE RESPONSE TO DEFICIENCY LETTER

Pursuant to Rule 212 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. §§ 385.212 (2003), the California Independent Operator Corporation ("ISO") submits this motion seeking an expedited grant by the Commission of an extension of time to file its response to the Delegated Letter Order issued on August 7, 2003 in Docket No. ER03-942-000 ("Deficiency Letter"), which directed the ISO, within 30 days, to provide additional explanation regarding several issues concerning the ISO's Tariff Amendment No. 53. The ISO requests a 40-day extension of time. The ISO is authorized to represent that no party that filed either a protest or comments with respect to Tariff Amendment No. 53 objects to this request. In light of the lack of opposition, the ISO requests that the Commission act favorably on the motion as soon as possible, in any event within one week. If the Commission determines that it is necessary to allow time for answers to this filing, the ISO asks that the Commission shorten the period for such responses to three business days and still act within one week. The ISO has emailed a copy of this motion today to counsel for each party that filed protests or comments in this proceeding, in addition to effecting normal service by mail.

The ISO requests this extension because of the absence of critical personnel during the 30-day time period for response. Specifically, the ISO's Controller, whose input is essential in order to prepare complete and accurate responses to the questions raised in the Deficiency Letter, left the country on a long-planned family sojourn on August 9, 2003, one business day after the Deficiency Letter was issued, and is not scheduled to return until September 12, 2003. The ISO cannot realistically begin to prepare its response to the Deficiency Letter until the Controller returns. For this reason, the ISO respectfully requests that this motion be granted on an expedited basis as noted above, and that its response to the Deficiency Letter be due on October 16, 2003.
