Dear Mr. Anders:

On November 10, 2011, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submitted for filing revisions to an Interconnected Control Area Operating Agreement (Agreement) with the Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District to implement pseudo-ties consistent with its dynamic transfers policy, recently approved by the Commission.¹ Waiver of the Commission's notice requirements pursuant to section 35.11 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 35.11) is granted,² and the revised records to the Agreement are accepted, effective November 12, 2011.

This filing was noticed on November 15, 2011, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before December 1, 2011. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.
