  - I. The study houses a Technical Report (beginning on page 81 of the document), which is of particular importance as it depicts potential market outcomes given differing service and footprint scenarios. The neutral and state-specific evaluation offers information for Western states to recognize potential benefits and impacts of expansion of their market participation. The report's "key findings" depict greater possible achieved annual gross savings in conjunction with a larger participating footprint and greater coordination.
  - II. Revisiting the SB 350 mandated study leverages existing and foundational information regarding possible market expansion. The study similarly concludes that greater coordination across the West through an expanded, CAISO operated market would result in environmental and economic benefits to California and Western participants.
