Reference: Tariff Amendment for Bid Generation Exemption

On April 9, 2019, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed tariff revisions to exempt Combined Heat and Power Resources, Conditionally Available Resources, and Non-Dispatchable Resources from CAISO's bid generation rules where such resources provide Resource Adequacy Capacity but do not submit bids in accordance with section 40.6.1 (Day-Ahead Availability) or section 40.6.2 (Real-Time Availability) of CAISO's tariff. Waiver of the Commission's notice requirements pursuant to section 35.11 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 35.11) is granted,<sup>1</sup> and the tariff revisions are accepted for filing, effective April 1, 2019, as requested.<sup>2</sup>

This filing was noticed on April 10, 2019, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before April 23, 2019. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.
