Notice of Tariff Change

Take notice that on April 30, 1999, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (ISO) tendered for filing a proposed amendment (Amendment No. 16) to the ISO Tariff, which establishes the Grid Management Charge to be effective July 1, 1999.

Pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S. C. §824d and Section 35.13(a)(2)(iii) of the Commission's Regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 35.13(a)(2)(iii), the ISO seeks approval of the Grid Management Charge rate formula and assessment provisions, and requests that the Commission permit the proposed Tariff changes to go into effect on July 1, 1999, without being subject to refund. In the alternative, if the Commission orders refunds, the ISO requests that it be authorized to institute a surcharge to recover the refunded revenues from other customers.

The ISO states that this filing has been served upon the Public Utilities Commission of California, the California Energy Commission, the California Electricity Oversight Board, on all parties with effective Scheduling Coordinator Agreements under the ISO Tariff, and all parties on the official service list for Dockets Nos. EL99-47-000 and ER99-473-000.

Any person desiring to be heard or to protest said filing should file a motion to intervene or protest with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, N.E., Washington, D.C. 20426, in accordance with Rules 211 and 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. §§ 385.211, 385.214). All such motions or protests should be filed on or before []. Protests filed with the Commission will be considered by it in determining the appropriate action to be taken but will not serve to make the protestants parties to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a motion to intervene. Copies of this filing are on file with the Commission and are available for public inspection.
