Dear Secretary Bose:

The California Independent System Operator Corporation ("CAISO") hereby submits for filing a Certificate of Concurrence with respect to the Large Generator Interconnection Agreement ("LGIA") among Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E"), PG&E, and the CAISO ("Prospect LGIA]").1

I. Overview and Designated Filer

On August 6, 2020, PG&E submitted the Prospect LGIA in Docket No. ER20-2624 -000, with a requested effective date of October 7, 2020. In that filing, PG&E explained that changes to the CAISO *pro forma* LGIA were made to eliminate unnecessary accounting transactions within PG&E and allow PG&E to account for construction expenditures in accordance with the FERC Uniform System of Accounts. The Prospect LGIA deviates from the CAISO *pro forma* LGIA, as explained in PG&E's August 6, 2020 filing.

Rather than filing a duplicate version of the Prospect LGIA under the CAISO tariff, the CAISO is submitting a concurrence tariff record. The concurrence tariff record is designated under the CASO tariff as Service Agreement No. 6197.

The CAISO submits this filing pursuant to Sections 35.1 and 131.52 of the Commission's regulations, 18 C.F.R. §§ 35.1, 131.52.

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PG&E serves as the "designated filer" as to the Prospect LGIA pursuant to the Joint Tariff Filing procedures outlined in Order No. 714.² As the Participating Transmission Owner and Interconnection Customer to the LGIA, PG&E filed the service agreement under PG&E's FERC Electric Tariff, Original Volume No. 5 and designated it as Service Agreement No. 395.

II. Proposed Effective Date and General Request for Waivers

The CAISO respectfully requests any waivers of the Commission's filing regulations necessary to establish an effective date of October 7, 2020 for its Certificate of Concurrence for the Prospect LGIA, consistent with the October 7, 2020 effective date that PG&E requested in its August 6, 2020 filing. To the extent that the enclosed materials and information do not meet the detailed filing requirements of the Commission's regulations, the CAISO respectfully requests that the Commission grant any necessary waivers.
