Dear Secretary Boergers,

In an order issued January 9, 2001 in Docket No. EC01-14-000, the Commission authorized the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("ISO") to assume Operational Control of transmission facility interests owned by the City of Vernon, California ("Vernon"). *California System Operator Corp.*, 94 FERC ¶ 62,016. The Order also noted that the Section 203 application was part of the process of Vernon becoming a Participating Transmission Owner and that Vernon must also be a party to the Transmission Control Agreement ("TCA"). The Commission required the ISO to provide prompt notification of the date the disposition of the jurisdictional assets was consummated.

On February 21, 2001, the Commission accepted Vernon's becoming a party to the TCA. *California Independent System Operator Corp., et al.*, 94 FERC ¶ 61,141. Also on February 21, 2001, the Commission accepted the ISO's Utility Distribution Company ("UDC") Agreement with Vernon. *California Independent System Operator Corp.,* 94 FERC ¶ 61,145. The Commission granted waiver of the notice requirement so both the TCA and the UDC Agreement were made effective as of January 1, 2001. Accordingly, the ISO hereby provides notice that the disposition of the jurisdictional assets was consummated on January 1, 2001.
