On October 28, 2019, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed revisions to sections 41.2.2(b) and 41.8 of its tariff, in compliance with the Commission's September 27 Order<sup>1</sup> regarding enhancements to CAISO's Reliability Must-Run framework. The revisions are in satisfactory compliance with the September 27 Order, and are accepted for filing, effective September 28, 2019,<sup>2</sup> to coincide with the effective date of the tariff revisions accepted in that order.

This filing was noticed on October 29, 2019, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before November 18, 2019. No protests or adverse comments were filed.
