Dear Mr. Anders:

On April 28, 2017, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submitted a Coordinated Transmission Agreement (Agreement) between CAISO and the Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville). The Agreement sets forth the terms under which CAISO and Bonneville will share certain data and information to enhance coordination and manage energy imbalance market (EIM) flows on the Bonneville transmission system. Under the Agreement, Bonneville will, among other things, determine the transmission limits that it will enforce, and CAISO commits to respect the Bonneville transmission limits. Additionally, the Agreement establishes: (1) a coordinating committee to provide a forum for CAISO and Bonneville to meet and discuss issues associated with the Agreement, and (2) a working group for impacted stakeholders to discuss issues related to the implementation of the Agreement. The Agreement is accepted for filing, effective July 1, 2017, as requested.¹

The filing was noticed on April 28, 2017, with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before May 19, 2017. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is

governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This acceptance for filing shall not be construed as constituting approval of the referenced filing or of any rate, charge, classification or any rule, regulation or practice affecting such rate or service contained in your filed documents; nor shall such acceptance be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation associated therewith; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or any which may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This action is taken pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
