On December 21, 2005, you submitted, on behalf of California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO), revised tariff sheets to comply with the directives in the Commission's November 21, 2005 Order,<sup>1</sup> and to make a conforming tariff revision. The tariff revisions satisfactorily comply with the Commission's directives. Your submittal is accepted for filing effective September 23, 2005.

The filing was noticed on December 29, 2005, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before January 11, 2006. No adverse comments or protests were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of

This acceptance for filing shall not be construed as constituting approval of the referenced filing or of any rate, charge, classification or any rule, regulation or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such acceptance be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation associated therewith; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or any which may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

Authority to act on this matter is delegated to the Director, Division of Tariffs and Market Development - West under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
