Reference: Tariff Revisions to Modify Definitions of Short Start and Long Start Units

On March 24, 2022, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed tariff revisions to (1) revise the defined terms for Short Start Unit and Long Start Unit; (2) eliminate the definition of Fast Start Unit and Medium Start Unit; and (3) make conforming changes to CAISO's Tariff consistent with changes to the definitions. CAISO explains that the purpose of the revisions is to make the Tariff language align with existing CAISO market timelines and to ensure resources can be considered and committed in the day-ahead and real-time markets based on their start-up and minimum run times. CAISO requests an effective date of June 1, 2022. Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307 (2021), the revisions are accepted for filing, effective June 1, 2022, as requested.¹

The filing was publicly noticed, with interventions and protests due on or before April 14, 2022. Pursuant to Rule 214 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2021)), notices of intervention, timely-filed motions to intervene, and any unopposed motions to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. No protests or adverse comments were filed.
