Dear Ms. McKenna:

On March 30, 2009, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submitted revised tariff sheets to correct discrepancies between the Market Redesign and Technology Upgrade tariff (MRTU tariff) and the settlement procedures outlined in the CAISO's Business Practice Manuals and charge codes. The CAISO states that the basis for this revision is a PricewaterhouseCoopers audit which identified technical differences between settlements procedures contained in its MRTU tariff and the configuration of the relevant charge codes. Waiver of the Commission's notice requirements pursuant to section 35.11 of the Commission's rules and regulations (18 C.F.R. § 35.11) is granted, and your submittal is accepted for filing, effective March 31, 2009, as requested.

The filing was noticed on April 1, 2009, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before April 20, 2009. No comments or protests were filed. Notices of intervention and timely, unopposed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motions to intervene are governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in

the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against the CAISO.

This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Tariffs and Market Development - West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
