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The following agenda items were addressed:

Opening Comments:

Tibor Foki (IBEW 47) began a discussion on current industry news. The discussion focused on the following points;

- PG&E bankrupcy
- San Onofre decommissioning challenges
- Global energy production and renewables in California
- LADWP no longer repowering plants

Decision on 1/17/2019 General Session Minutes:

The January 17, 2019 meeting minutes were reviewed and approved with a correction in the spelling of censation.

Decision on 3/19/2019 Conference Call Minutes:

The March 19, 2019 meeting minutes were reviewed and approved with no objections noted.

SCE presentation on NESC / GO 95 updates:

Sam Stonerock, of SCE, presented on the pending and proposed revisions to GO 95 and the 2022 edition of the NESC. Sam reviewed and updated the group on the CPUC Rulemaking proceedings related to utility pole attachments, physical security risks, emergency and disaster preparedness, strategies and guidance for climate change adaptation, implementation of wildfire mitigation plans, de-energization of power lines and criteria and methodology for wildfire cost recovery.

Mr. Stonerock also updated the attendees on notable proposed changes to the NESC. The proposed changes include revisions to Section 14, Storage Batteries, adoption of a wind map consistent with ASCE, a new table that addresses live-front transformers and terminations and the replacement of Appendix D with IEEE/ESMOL white paper on "Practical Approaches to Reducing Transient Overvoltage Factor for Live-line Work"

SB 901 discussion:

Steve Rutty, of the CAISO, initiated a discussion on the current status of SB 901 implementation. The discussion focused on the following points;

- Largest impact will be the distribution system
- CPUC planning to ramp up internal staff and external reviewers
- Annual submission requirement
- GO 95 Rule 18 resulting in the acceleration of programs

Public Advocates Office presentation on Transportation Electrication:



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Fidel Leon Diaz, of ORA, presented on transportation electrication as part of an effort to promote alternative-fueled vehicles and as a method to achieve the State's goal to reduce greenhouse gas emmissions. Mr. Diaz explained the environmental and grid issues plus the legislative drivers behind transportation electrication.

Fidel presented on what constitutes a zero-emission vehicle, the electric vehicle supply infrastructure and vehicle-grid intergration. An overview of the programs currently in place, the implementation effort currently underway and the new load impacts were also discussed

Open discussion items:

The discussion focused on the following points;

- Steve Rutty, of the CAISO, provided an update on RC West certification
- TMCC focus on CAISO and CPUC overlap in reviewing transmission facilities
- Steve Rutty, of the CAISO, provided an overview on the history of the CAISO maintenance standards and how they are implemented.
- SDG&E infrared inspections and the vehicle platforms other PTOs are using. SDG&E considering moving towards helicopters (or drones) in the future.

New Business Issues and Future Agenda Items:

Steve Rutty asked the members to work with the CAISO over the next few months to decide which topics they would like to discuss at the next TMCC meeting. Suggestions provided at the meeting included a behind the meter storage pilot being implemented at SVP and an update from PG&E in their drone/helicopter inspection program.

Steve Rutty also asked the members if there were any business issues requiring the TMCC reconvene at the regularly scheduled meeting in July. There were none and membership agreed to forgo the July meeting and meet again in October.
