MOTION TO CONSOLIDATE OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR CORPORATION

I. Introduction

Pursuant to Rule 212 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (the "Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. § 212 (2001),¹ the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("ISO") hereby submits this Motion to Consolidate an errata to its proposed 2002 Grid Management Charge ("GMC"), with the GMC filing itself, in Docket No. ER02-250-000. The errata has been assigned to Docket No. ER02-527-000.

II. Background

On November 2, 2001, the ISO filed with the Commission its proposed 2002 GMC, which was assigned to Docket No. ER02-250-000. As part of its proposed 2002 GMC, the ISO included several proposed changes to its tariff ("ISO Tariff"). The ISO had intended to include language in its November 2 filing to modify Appendix F, Schedule 1, Part B of the ISO Tariff, to allow for quarterly adjustment of the revenue requirement of

each service category to reflect cost savings that reduce the ISO's revenue requirement, and/or to reflect unanticipated collections of fines and penalties. This provision was inadvertently omitted from the November 2 filing and was submitted as an errata on December 7, 2001 ("errata filing") in Docket No. ER02-250-000.

The Commission originally noticed the errata filing in Docket ER02-250-001 on December 12, 2001. Subsequently, the Commission re-noticed the ISO's errata filing in Docket No. ER02-527-000 on December 14, 2001. The proposed 2002 GMC in Docket No. ER02-250-000 has since been accepted for filing, suspended for a nominal period, to become effective January 1, 2002, subject to refund, and set for hearing. See California Independent System Operator 97 FERC ¶ 61, 303 (Dec. 20, 2001)

III. Discussion

The errata filing made by the ISO on December 7, 2001 expands the use of the GMC quarterly adjustment mechanism by revising Appendix F, Schedule 1, Part B of the ISO Tariff and is therefore an integral part of the ISO's 2002 GMC proposal. In fact, references to the potential use of the new mechanism are found in the ISO's November 2 filing. See Ex. Nos. ISO-8 at 8; ISO-9 at 6. The proposed ISO Tariff change submitted in the errata allows for cost savings and/or unanticipated collections of fines and penalties to be passed on to the ISO's customers through reduced GMC rates through a quarterly adjustment, rather than on an annual basis, thus passing through savings to the ISO's customers more quickly.

The issues raised by the ISO's proposed change to Schedule 1, Part B of the ISO Tariff are inextricably related to the larger GMC proposal for 2002. In considering

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whether the proposed change contained in the ISO's errata filing, or the other provisions of the proposed 2002 GMC, are just and reasonable, it will be necessary to consider the effect of the ISO's errata filing on the overall GMC proposal, and vice versa. To avoid the wastefully duplicative and potentially chaotic process that will likely result if one element of the ISO's 2002 GMC proposal is reviewed out of context, the ISO respectfully requests that Docket No. ER02-527-000 be consolidated with Docket No. ER02-250-000.

IV. Conclusion

Wherefore, the ISO respectfully requests that the Commission grant the relief requested above.
