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II. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

On July 13, 2000, Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") tendered for filing with the Commission an Emergency Service Agreement Between Pacific Gas & Electric Company and Northern California Power Agency

("NCPA"). PG&E states that the agreement is intended to facilitate NCPA's supplying of excess and reserve energy to the ISO to support the reliability of the electric grid in California. Under the Agreement, when the ISO requests dispatch of excess energy from NCPA and pays PG&E (as NCPA's Scheduling Coordinator) therefor, PG&E will transfer the payments to NCPA.

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission systems of PG&E, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Southern California Edison Company, as well as for the coordination of the competitive electricity market in California. The agreement will affect the procedures by which the ISO maintains the reliability of the grid. The ISO therefore has an interest in the proceeding that cannot adequately be represented by any other party.

The ISO is committed to, and responsible for, maintaining fair and nondiscriminatory access to the electric grid in California. Therefore, the ISO's participation in the proceeding is also in the public interest.

Accordingly, the ISO requests that it be permitted to intervene herein with full rights of a party.

III. CONCLUSION

Wherefore, for the foregoing reasons, the ISO respectfully requests that the Commission permit it to intervene, and that it be accorded full party status in this proceeding.
