MOTION TO INTERVENE OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR CORPORATION

Pursuant to Rule 214 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("Commission"), 18 C.F.R. § 385.214, and the Commission's November 3, 2000, Notice of Filing, the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("ISO") hereby moves to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. In support thereof, the ISO states as follows:

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II. BACKGROUND

On October 31, 2000, the Western Systems Coordinating Council ("WSCC") tendered for filing with the Commission amendments to its Reliability Criteria Agreement ("RCA") and individual Reliability Management System Agreements under the WSCC's Reliability Management System ("RMS"). The WSCC states, in its filing, that the

amendments are necessary to correct several problems with the original agreements, and to add four new reliability criteria to the program.

III. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission systems of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Southern California Edison Company, as well as for the coordination of the competitive electricity market in California.

The ISO is a member of the WSCC, and a signatory to the RCA and to an individual RMS Agreement that the WSCC seeks to amend in this proceeding. That being the case, the ISO has an interest in the proceeding that cannot adequately be represented by any other party. Accordingly, the ISO requests that it be permitted to intervene herein with full rights of a party.

The ISO raises no substantive issues at the present time but reserves the right to do so in any further aspects of the proceeding ordered by the Commission. The ISO also reserves the right to file supplemental comments if warranted.

IV. CONCLUSION

Wherefore, for the foregoing reasons, the ISO respectfully requests that the Commission permit it to intervene, and that it be accorded full party status in this proceeding.
