MOTION TO INTERVENE OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR CORPORATION

II. BACKGROUND

On December 28, 2001, as described in the Notice of Filing, Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") tendered for filing changes in rates for the Transmission Revenue Balancing Account Adjustment ("TRBAA") rate set forth in its Transmission Owner Tariff ("TO Tariff"), the Reliability Services ("RS") rates set forth in both its TO Tariff and its Reliability Services Tariff ("RS Tariff") and the Transmission Access Charge Balancing Account Adjustment ("TACBAA") also set forth in its TO Tariff. PG&E requested that, with the exception of the TACBAA rate, these charges in rates be made effective January 1, 2002.

III. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission systems of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and Southern California Edison Company, as well as for the coordination of the competitive electricity market in California. As the operator of this grid, the ISO believes that it has a unique interest in any Commission proceeding concerning the PG&E proposals described above.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the ISO respectfully requests that the Commission permit it to intervene, and that it be accorded full party status in this proceeding.
