II. BACKGROUND

On September 2, 2004, Southern California Edison (SCE) submitted for proposed revisions to SCE's Transmission Owner Tariff, FERC Electric Tariff, Second Revised Volume No. 6, Appendix VI, to increase SCE's Reliability Services Revenue Requirement and Reliability Services rates.

By its Notice issued September 9, 2004, the Commission established September 23, 2004, as the date motions to intervene are to be filed in the above-captioned proceeding.
