#### II. BACKGROUND

On October 28, 2004, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submitted its Transmission Owner Tariff for the Transmission Revenue Balancing Account Adjustment rate and the Reliability Services Rates. PG&E requests an effective date of January 1, 2005.

By its Notice issued November 2, 2004, the Commission established November 18, 2004, as the date motions to intervene are to be filed in the above-captioned proceeding.

#### III. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission systems of PG&E, Southern California Edison Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company and the Cities of Vernon, Anaheim, Azusa, Banning and Riverside, California. the ISO believes that it has a unique interest in any Commission proceeding concerning the issues raised in the captioned proceeding.
