MOTION TO INTERVENE OF THE CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPEPERATOR CORPORATION

Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 CFR 385.214) of the Federal Energy Regulatory

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Commission's ("the Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, and the

Commission's June 25, 2003 "Order to Show Cause Concerning Gaming and/or

Anomalous Market Behavior," 103 FERC ¶ 61,345 (2003) ("Show Cause Order"),

the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("ISO"), by and through

its undersigned counsel, hereby moves to intervene in this proceeding. In

support therefor, the ISO states as follows:

II. BACKGROUND

In the Show Cause Order, the Commission required over 40 entities to show cause, in an evidentiary hearing to be held before an administrative law judge ("ALJ"), why they should not be found to have engaged in activities that constitute gaming and/or anomalous market behavior in violation of the ISO and California Power Exchange Tariffs during the period from January 1, 2000 to June 20, 2001. The Commission based its conclusion that these entities appear to have engaged in these types of behavior on the provisions of the ISO Tariff, several studies prepared by the ISO concerning trading and scheduling practices in the ISO Markets, a Commission Staff report, and evidence submitted by market participants. The Commission also directed the ALJ to "hear evidence and render findings and conclusions quantifying the full extent to which the

Identified Entities may have been unjustly enriched as a result of their conduct" and also noted that the ALJ "may recommend the monetary remedy of disgorgement of unjust profits and any other additional, appropriate nonmonetary remedies." Show Cause Order at P 2.

Additionally, the Commission ordered the ISO, within 21 days of the date of the Show Cause Order, to provide the entities named in the order with all of the transaction data for each practice described in the ISO's studies that was found by the Commission to constitute a violation of the ISO Tariff, as well as an explanation of the screens that it used to identify the transactions in question. The ISO was also directed to file this data with the Commission.

III. BASIS FOR MOTION TO INTERVENE

The ISO is a non-profit public benefit corporation organized under the laws of the State of California and responsible for the reliable operation of a grid comprising the transmission systems of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, the City of Vernon, California, and Southern California Edison, as well as for the coordination and monitoring of the competitive electricity market in California.

As the grid operator and market monitor, the ISO has a direct and substantial interest in this proceeding that cannot be adequately represented by other parties. Moreover, it is the ISO's Tariff that the Commission has found may have been violated by the activities and behavior described in the Show Cause Order, and this finding was largely based on studies performed by the

ISO. For these reasons, the participation of the ISO is in the public interest and should be granted.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the ISO respectfully requests that the

Commission permit it to intervene, and that it be accorded full party status in this

proceeding.
