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NEED FOR INCREASED CONSERVATION IS CRITICAL

Power Reserves Are Dangerously Low Today

(Folsom, CA) According to the California Independent System Operator (California ISO), **there is an increased risk of rotating power outages Tuesday, February 13, 2001 between 5:00-8:00 p.m.** Conservation efforts could assist the ISO with balancing the supply and demand of electricity today. Californians are urged to rededicate their conservation efforts by avoiding use of electrical appliances in the early evening.

A total of 10,000 megawatts are unavailable today with generators reporting to be offline because of planned and forced outages. Today is the 29th consecutive day of a Stage Three declaration which enables the California ISO to receive additional emergency assistance from federal and state agencies.

Today's peak demand on the ISO-controlled Grid is expected to reach 31,340 megawatts at approximately 6:00 p.m.
