Reference: Grid Management Charge Update

Dear Mr. Ivancovich:

On October 17, 2017, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submitted revisions to the Grid Management Charge (GMC) allocation percentages related to three service categories. Specifically, CAISO proposes to adjust the following service category percentages:

- (1) Market Services category is adjusted from 27% to 32%;
- (2) System Operations category is adjusted from 70% to 66%;
- (3) Congestion Revenue Rights Services category is adjusted from 3% to 2%.

CAISO also proposed some other minor clarifying tariff revisions that specify that certain components of service charges are calculated in the triennial cost-of-service study. The revised GMC allocation and other clarifying tariff revisions are accepted for filing, effective January 1, 2018, as requested.<sup>1</sup>

The filing was noticed on October 18, 2017, with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before November 7, 2017. No protests or adverse comments

were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such acceptance be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation associated therewith; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or any which may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This action is taken pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
