On August 25, 2021, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed a Certificate of Concurrence related to the non-conforming Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA) filed by Southern California Edison Company (SoCal Edison). The LGIA was among Arica Solar, LLC, SoCal Edison, and CAISO. CAISO requests an effective date of August 5, 2021, the requested effective date of the LGIA.

Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307 (2021), your submittal is accepted for filing, effective August 5, 2021, as requested.³

The filing was publicly noticed, with interventions and protests due on or before September 15, 2021. Pursuant to Rule 214 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. §

385.214 (2021)), notices of intervention, timely-filed motions to intervene, and any unopposed motions to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. Granting a late intervention at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt the proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed document(s); nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713 (2021).
