Background

Some form of operational assessment is performed each year.

Audit Committee briefed on the 2011 Operational Assessment scope and plan in July 2011.

Important change this year is the assessment was performed under Attestation standards – our report is an Audit/Attestation opinion.

Management determined the subject of the assessment – Exceptional Dispatch.

Scope of Assessment

Assessment period determined by PwC:

- Alhambra September 27 29, 2011
- Folsom October 17 19, 2011

Scope of Assessment (continued)

Covers five functional aspects of Exceptional Dispatch Operating Procedures:

- 1) Priority of committed/dispatched units.
- 2) Documentation of long-start units selected for commitment.
- 3) SLIC logging of units selected for commitment/dispatch.
- 4) Committed/dispatched units entered into market system are logged.
- 5) Initial unit commitment conditions are set in the day-ahead market.

Findings

PwC

Exceptional Dispatch occurrences tested - 109 commitment/dispatch instructions issued during the assessment period.

Form of Report

Management provided PwC management assertion consisting of:

- Procedural Elements extracted from two ISO Exceptional Dispatch Operating Procedures.
- Criteria to test compliance with Procedural Elements.
- ISO's self-assessment of compliance with the criteria.

Exception condition agreed to by management and therefore included in the management assertion.

PwC opinion covers management's assertion on Exceptional Dispatch; does not report directly on subject matter.

Related Reporting

ISO reports Exceptional Dispatches to FERC each month.

Primary differences between FERC report and the criteria tested in our report:

- Our scope was more granular individual dispatches and commitments.
- FERC report groups individual unit dispatches and commitments.

PwC did not audit the FERC reporting.
