## adssta.caiso.com vs. ads.caiso.com

- The ISO would like to retire Production ADS address adssta.caiso.com
  - Would like to support one common address: ads.caiso.com
  - “sta” may make users think of “Staging”
- Both of ads and adssta DNS locations point to the same set of IP addresses
- ADS Thick Client is not affected -- currently bundled with <https://ads.caiso.com>.
- No set date yet – likely in the next couple of months after gauging participant feedback

## SOAP Messages – Upcoming Changes

- CAISO will make WSDL's more user friendly and ready-to-use
- CAISO will update the [developer.caiso.com](http://developer.caiso.com) website with WSDL's participants can use “out of the box”
- CAISO will phase out the requirement that SOAP messages be digitally signed, and similarly, also phase out the CAISOWSHeader element.
  - Strong TLS offers adequate security for transactions
  - CAISO will use the identity provided by the user certificate passed to https (following model we use for UI traffic, and ADS API)

# SOAP Messages – Upcoming Changes

Participant Action for removal of WS-Security requirement:

- Ideally, no SOAP/XML updates will be required of participants
- The only likely change which may be required is to ensure the certificate you pass to https is the cert you want to use for the identity of your request
