Second, Amendment No. 38 would modify the Imbalance Energy Market to allow energy from contingency-only operating reserves to be separated (or "ordered") in real time Energy procurement from Operating Reserve energy that can be used for real time imbalance in the real time Imbalance Energy market (or "BEEP") Stack
