


Decision on EIM Go-Live Enhancements




Management has identified two EIM market design changes needed for go-live

- Subject EIM transfer limits into EIM balancing authority areas to market power mitigation process
- Allow negotiated transition costs for non-gas resources to use multi-stage generation functionality




Illustrative example of a structurally competitive market



More non-PAC supply than non-PAC demand



Example of a structurally non-competitive market



More non-PAC demand than non-PAC supply



Department of Market Monitoring has completed a structural competitive assessment of PacifiCorp BAAs

- PacifiCorp East not likely to be structurally competitive during most hours
- PacifiCorp West likely to be structurally competitive during most hours, but could be uncompetitive if scheduling limits from ISO reduced



Given DMM assessment, Management recommends...

Apply automated market power mitigation to EIM scheduling constraints into PacifiCorp BAAs

- Evaluate options for reducing unnecessary mitigation
 - Future stakeholder initiative to develop automated dynamic approach based on actual EIM transfer limits



During implementation activities, non-gas units requested to use multi-stage generation functionality

- Current tariff assumes multi-stage generation resources are natural gas fueled resources
- Need to allow negotiated rate for transition costs when fuel source is not natural gas



Stakeholders generally support the proposed changes

- Market power mitigation process warranted given structural competitiveness assessment
- Multi-stage generation functionality expanded to non-gas resources will increase participation in EIM
- Support immediate tariff filing with effective date consistent with EIM go-live

Management recommends Board approve the EIM go-live enhancements

- Applying market mitigation process to EIM transfer limits into EIM balancing authority areas addresses structural non-competitiveness of PacifiCorp balancing authority areas
- Allowing non-gas resources to use multi-stage generator functionality will increase EIM market efficiency
- Tariff filing will request effective date consistent with EIM go-live in October
