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Reference: Custom Load Aggregation Point Price Calculation Methodology Tariff Revisions

On December 18, 2018, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed proposed tariff revisions to reduce the incidence of inconsistencies between settlement prices and bid-in prices of scheduled transactions in CAISO's markets.¹ Specifically, CAISO states that the proposed tariff revisions: (1) calculate settlement prices for custom load aggregation points in the same manner as the methodology for calculating default load aggregation points; (2) consolidate the description for pricing default and custom local aggregation points in the tariff; and (3) update and correct cross-references in the revised tariff. The tariff revisions are accepted for filing, effective March 1, 2019, as requested.

This filing was noticed on December 18, 2019, with comments, protests, or motions to intervene due on or before January 8, 2019. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in
