PAT: Hey, I just got a call from Powerex
BOYD: Uh-huh.
PAT: And they said they had some energy available
BOYD: Okay.
PAT: The price is higher.
BOYD Uh-huh
PAT: They're asking 850.
BOYD: 850?
PAT: Yeah
