Mary Leslie

California ISO Board of Governors

Gov. Gavin Newsom reappointed Mary Leslie to the California Independent System Operator (ISO) Board of Governors in February 2021 for a three-year term. Confirmation by the California state Senate is pending.

Ms. Leslie was previously appointed by Gov. Newsom to the ISO Board in January 2019.

Ms. Leslie has served as president of Los Angeles Business Council since 2001, helping to grow the council into a prominent organization that works with business, government, and non-profit groups to enact policies and programs that strengthen Los Angeles' economy and quality of life. She also currently serves on the LA Sustainability Leadership Council, the UCLA Advisory Committee for the Luskin Center for Innovation, and LA Cleantech Incubator, and is a member of the Pacific Council on International Policy.

Ms. Leslie was deputy mayor for the City of Los Angeles under Mayor Richard Riordan and a Los Angeles Department of Water and Power Commissioner under Mayor James Hahn. She was previously deputy director of the U.S. Small Business Administration and executive director of the California Economic Development Commission.

Ms. Leslie earned a bachelor's degree from University of Santa Clara, and a master's degree in Public Administration from the University of Southern California. She also attended the Executive Management Program at the UCLA Anderson School of Management.
