> **California Independent System Operator Corporation** Re: Recollation Filing to Modify Collation Values of CAISO's eTariff of Commission-Approved Tariff Records - Filing 2 of 2

Dear Secretary Bose:

The California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) submits this recollation filing to modify the collation values of multiple tariff records in the CAISO Open Access Transmission Tariff (OATT). The CAISO does not propose any changes to Commission-approved tariff language in this filing. Instead, the purpose of this filing is to reassign the collation values for multiple tariff records in the CAISO OATT.<sup>2</sup> The CAISO's eTariff database is near the cap of collation values and new collation values need to be assigned to a portion of the tariff records to ensure new tariff records can continue to be added in future filings.<sup>3</sup>

The CAISO requests that the Commission accept the recollated tariff records contained in this filing effective as of the latest effective date previously approved by the Commission for each tariff record.

## I. DESCRIPTION OF FILING

During a recent filing to add a new appendix at the end of the CAISO OATT,<sup>4</sup> it was discovered that the collation value that was needed was near the cap. To avoid running out of space in the CAISO OATT database, the CAISO is proposing to reassign the collation values for all tariff records starting with Appendix L through Appendix II.

Due to the number of tariff records involved, the CAISO is splitting this filing into two submissions. Earlier today, a filing was submitted reassigning the collation values of Appendix L, through Appendix Z. This filing includes the new collation values for all tariff records starting with Appendix AA through Appendix II, specifically all subsections, articles, appendices and attachments of each appendix.

No redlines are included with this filing since no tariff modifications are proposed.

The CAISO requests that the Commission accept the recollated tariff records contained in this filing effective as of the latest effective date previously approved by the Commission for each tariff record.<sup>5</sup>
