Enclosed for filing please find a copy of a tariff sheet for the California Independent System Operator Corporation ("ISO")¹ FERC Electric Tariff, submitted in compliance with the Commission's June 30, 2000 order in the above-referenced docket.

On January 27, 2000, the ISO filed Amendment No. 25 to the ISO Tariff in the above-referenced docket. Among other things, Amendment No. 25 modified the ISO Tariff to provide for the clarification of the ISO's procedures with respect to the cancellation or rescheduling of planned transmission outages. On March 29, 2000, the Commission issued an order accepting Amendment No. 25, subject to certain modifications, and directing the ISO to submit a compliance filing within 30 days of the issuance of the order. *California Independent System Operator Corporation*, 90 FERC ¶ 61,316 (2000) ("Amendment No. 25 Order"). The Commission directed the ISO to filed revised tariff sheets to provide for compensation for costs incurred by Transmission Owners in rescheduling maintenance outages. Amendment No. 25 Order at 62,051.

On April 28, 2000, the ISO submitted a compliance filing in the above-referenced docket. Among other things, the compliance filing proposed to add a new section to the ISO Tariff, Section 2.3.3.6.4, to provide for the allocation of transmission outage cancellation costs. The Commission accepted the compliance filing, subject to the modification that Section 2.3.3.6.4 should reflect the principle that the allocation of outage cancellation costs should be to all Scheduling Coordinators in proportion to their metered Demand during the Settlement Period(s) that the outage was originally

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scheduled to have occurred. *California Independent System Operator Corporation*, 91 FERC ¶ 61,341, 62,155 (2000) ("Amendment No. 25 Compliance Filing Order"). The ISO now submits a revision to the ISO Tariff to incorporate the modification described in the Amendment No. 25 Compliance Filing Order.

Enclosed is a revised tariff sheet which incorporates the revision described above (Attachment A), as well as the text in black-line format of the affected tariff provisions identifying the changes made in the present compliance filing (Attachment B). Also enclosed is a notice of filing suitable for publication in the Federal Register (Attachment C) and a computer disk containing the notice in WordPerfect format.
