1:45 – 3:15 p.m.	EDAM Enhancements: Stabilizing the Markets and Prioritizing What Comes Next EDAM has successfully moved from market design into implementation and operations. The market is live with CAISO and PacifiCorp, while additional entities, including Portland General Electric, will be in the earliest days of participation. This panel will explore how the CAISO, EDAM entities, and stakeholders identify, evaluate, and prioritize potential enhancements following market launch. Panelists will discuss the distinction between operational refinements and policy-driven market design changes, how enhancement ideas are being identified and vetted, and what factors should guide future roadmap priorities.
