PacifiCorp is an investor-owned utility with two balancing authority areas in the western interconnection spanning across parts of California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Utah and Wyoming. PacifiCorp's transmission network of over 16,300 miles of high voltage lines is highly integrated with other transmission providers in the western United States. PacifiCorp is interconnected with more than 80 generation plants and 13 adjacent balancing authority areas at approximately 152 points of interconnection. In addition, PacifiCorp owns, or has interest in, 74 generation resources with a net owned capacity of approximately 11,240 MW.

PacifiCorp was the first Energy Imbalance Market ("EIM") Entity to sign an EIM implementation agreement with the California ISO. As the Vice President and General Counsel of PacifiCorp's transmission business division, I have played a central role in the development of EIM policy and market design as well as ongoing tariff, regulatory, and stakeholder initiatives relating to the EIM. Since February of 2013, I have been actively engaged in all aspects of the EIM design, development, and implementation. I bring a solid appreciation for and understanding of the issues around governance and jurisdiction that will be central to the ongoing mission of the EIM Transitional Committee. I believe that the combination of my EIM and industry experience and legal background positions me well for participation on the EIM Transitional Committee.

As my qualifications show, I have been working in the energy industry for over 12 years in various legal, compliance and operational roles. I have had experience in several types of industry and regional initiatives, with many contacts and relationships throughout the regulatory and policy communities of the west.
