Dear Mr. Ivancovich:

On October 3, 2008, the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) submitted a filing in compliance with Commission Order No. 890-B.¹ The CAISO explains in its filing that the directives in Order No. 890-B are inapplicable to the CAISO's transmission service model. The CAISO also states that the services provided under its transmission service model are consistent with or superior to the pro forma Open Access Transmission Tariff. We find that the CAISO has satisfactorily complied with the directives of Order No. 890-B.

The filing was noticed on October 15, 2008, with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before October 24, 2008. No protests or comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.
