CALIFORNIA ISO AND OES UNVEIL PLANS FOR NOTIFYING PUBLIC OF POSSIBLE ROTATING OUTAGES

STORY: The California Independent System Operator (California ISO) and Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES) will unveil their plans responding to Governor Gray Davis' Executive Order to provide 48-, 24-, and one-hour notifications when there is a high possibility of rotating outages. Early warnings of possible blackouts allow the public to better prepare and encourages energy conservation.

BACKGROUND: The Notification Plans will roll out as grid conditions warrant. E-technology will be used as the primary tool to issue forecasts 48-, 24-, and one- hour in advance of potential blackouts based on such factors as weather, plant outages, and supply and demand.
