On May 28, 2002, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CA ISO) submitted for filing an outage form and a description of the system that the CA ISO has in place to collect and analyze information related to generator outages in compliance with the Commission's February 27, 2002 Order¹ related to Outage Coordination procedures. Your outage form and accompanying description is accepted as being in compliance with the Commission's directives.

This filing was noticed on June 21, 2002, with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before June 28, 2002. No protests or comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action is taken pursuant to the authority delegated to the Director, Division of Tariffs and Market Development - West under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. Further, this order
