ORDER ADOPTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

(Issued December 17, 2002)

1. The California Independent System Operator, various intervenors,¹ and Commission Staff² have submitted a Joint Proposed Procedural Schedule which I find to be reasonable and consistent with the Track II timelines established by the Chief Judge for this proceeding. The proposed schedule, with all dates in 2003, is hereby adopted as follows:

July 16	Joint Statement of Issues
July 21	Hearing Commences

2. Discovery will commence immediately and will be in accordance with the Time Standards for Discovery of the Office of Administrative Law Judges, except that (1) no responses will be due prior to January 7; and (2) subsequent to May 23, responses will be due in 7 business days and objections must be made within 3 business days. Responses will be served electronically on the date due, except for any documents that exist only in hard copy. Hard copy will be served by overnight delivery on the date due. A restricted service list will be adopted for use in this proceeding. The Protective Order issued by the Chief Judge on June 9, 2000, in Docket No. ER00-2019-00, and all associated non-disclosure certificates, is hereby adopted by agreement of the parties for continued use in this proceeding.
