On February 20, 2020, California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed tariff revisions in compliance with the Commission's order issued on January 21, 2020.¹ Specifically, CAISO filed revisions to sections 30.4.1 and 31.6.1 that were accepted by the Commission but inadvertently omitted from CAISO's initial filing in this docket. The revisions are in satisfactory compliance with the January 21, 2020 order, and are accepted for filing, effective January 28, 2020.²

However, CAISO's revised tariff record for section 30.4.1 does not contain approved provisions in section 30.4.1.1.6. Therefore, CAISO must make a compliance filing, within 30 days of the date of this letter order, to correct section 30.4.1.1.6 in eTariff.

The filing was noticed on February 21, 2020, with protests or interventions due on or before March 12, 2020. No protests or adverse comments were filed. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. §

385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against CAISO.

This action is taken pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation - West, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307. This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
